How much does it cost?

\$25 Deposit Due at Time of Registration (non-refundable after 6/6)

Remainder due at the beginning of camp

Camper Registration Fee:

Early Registration (postmarked by 5/9) \$90
Regular Registration (postmarked by 6/6) \$95
Late Registration (postmarked after 6/6) \$105

Others:

Pre-Camper \$60
Staff \$60

Registration fees for Children's Camp include all meals, lodging in an air-conditioned dormitory, curriculum, recreation, t-shirt, crafts, and snack shack. Fees apply to all campers/staff and Family Leaders.

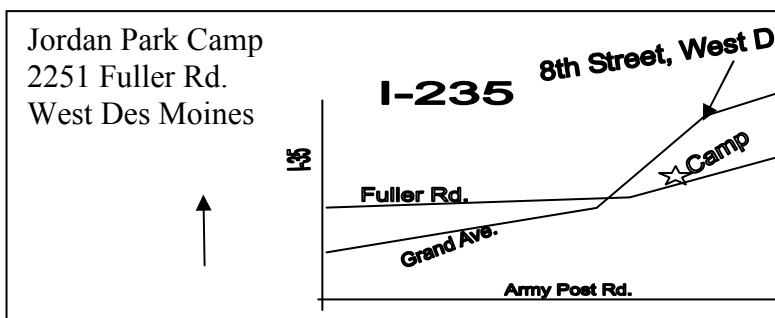
What happens if someone needs to cancel?

We urge you to locate a substitute for anyone who may need to cancel. We cannot refund registration fees, except in the case of a death in the family or illness of a participant with written advice from his/her doctor indicating he/she should not come to camp. A \$25.00 processing fee will be subtracted from any approved assignments, which will have already been made.

What time do campers need to be at Jordan Park Camp?

Children's Camp will begin at **11:00 a.m. on Monday, June 20th** and conclude at **8:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 23rd**. Families are invited to join us for worship at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday after which campers will be dismissed to return home. Because of the ever increasing number of campers and staff, we ask that parent's NOT plan on eating supper at camp and not arrive before 6:15 p.m. **NO LATE CHECK-INS or EARLY DEPARTURES WILL BE PERMITTED**, unless you have written notification, from your parents, with you at registration. All participants should remain on campus from registration on Monday until checkout on Thursday. We will serve lunch on Monday. **CAMPERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE DORMS BEFORE 11:00 a.m. on Monday, June 20th**.

What are Family Groups?

All campers will be divided into groups of 6-10 campers/staff by age-group. These groups are called *families*. Campers in the same age-group from the same church will be grouped together as much as possible.

What should I NOT bring?

(Food will NOT be permitted in the dorms)

What DO I need to bring?

PLEASE MARK EVERYTHING WITH YOUR NAME!!!

Clothing

Modest shorts, tops (a couple of outfits need to be for getting 'grungy')
At least 1 pair of long pants
Jacket or sweatshirt (it may get cool at night)
Tennis shoes for recreation
Swimwear (girl's two-piece swimsuits must be covered by a t-shirt)
There is no pool, but there will be LOTS of chances to get wet!
Campers are not required to dress up for chapel
LARGE Plastic bag for dirty clothes

The dorms are air conditioned, so fans should NOT be needed.
STAFF SHOULD BRING A WATCH – as cell phones will not be allowed in the dorms.

CAMP RULES

Campers/Staff must remain on campus. No camper/staff is permitted to leave the campground while attending Children's Camp, unless you have written approval from a parent and/or guardian with the time you will be leaving, with whom you will be leaving, and with the time you will be returning. Please submit this information at registration on Monday.

Campers/Staff will attend all camp activities. The only exception to this is if you are injured or sick and are at the camp office, or nurse's station.

Campers/Staff who are ill or injured should be in the nurse's station. In the event of illness or injury, campers/staff will not be permitted to remain in their dorm rooms. Campers/staff who are ill or injured will be required to rest in the nurse's station until they are able to return to their regularly scheduled activities.

Drugs, alcohol, any form of tobacco, firearms, fireworks, or other inappropriate materials are NOT permitted. Please do not bring any type of electronic devices with you to camp except what is necessary for personal grooming.

Campers/staff should dress in a way that would be pleasing to God. Modest shorts, T-shirts and other clothing should cover your body and display only words that are glorifying to God!

Campers/staff should always wear their name button. These are color-coded which helps staff identify to which group a camper belongs.

Public/Private Display of Affection (PDA) of any kind is not allowed.

Under NO circumstances are girls to be in guy's rooms or guys in girl's rooms.

Cell phones. Campers/staff will be asked to turn in cell phones and all other electronics at registration. Please come to the camp office if you need to make a call.

NO medication is allowed in the camper's dorms. This includes Tylenol, Tums, etc.

******Medications******

ALL medications must be turned in to the nurse at registration. **Please do not pack medication in your suitcase as it needs to be turned in BEFORE you unpack.** Please bring all medications in original container with written instructions. Camp Nurse is responsible for distribution of all medication.

NO medication is allowed in the camper's dorms. This includes Tylenol, Tums, etc.

ALL medications must be signed out by an adult picking up the camper at the end of camp.

A release must be signed by parents to administer ANY medication.

Please notify nurse at registration of any recent medical changes including antibiotics, accidents, recent or current illnesses.
